Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum



- ▶ At Rydon we follow Development Matters
- There are the seven Areas of Learning in EYFS: communication and language, personal, social and emotional development, physical development, literacy, mathematics, understanding the world, expressive arts and design
- Exciting topics each week/half term.
- ▶ Learn through **play** based activities.
- Daily maths and phonics lessons (Read, Write, Inc)
- ▶ Weekly indoor/outdoor PE lessons, music, ICT lessons
- ► Fortnightly outdoor learning sessions.

Snack/Playtime



- Morning Snack Healthy fruit snack (named) Water Bottle (named). Water only.

Free milk provided by Cool Milk Scheme (parents sign up for this. Need to pay when child turns 5.)

Children eat snacks in classroom then have playtime on front playground.

Children eat lunch in hall, then have playtime. Mealtime supervisors and Y6 buddies look after children at lunchtime.

Self-Care and Independence

Playing with Others



- I join in games and activities with other people.


