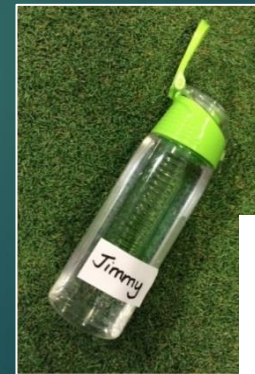
What your child needs to bring everyday....

Reading – ideally daily
x3 times a week - Y1 & Y2
- celebration book, book bag

Weekly Maths – Y2 – consolidation task
Later in the year – Sparx – Times tables

Occasionally – may get an additional task to complete if it links in with learning in class.

Homework at Rydon will be reviewed at some point this academic year.

Reading and phonics



Read daily – x3 times – their RWI books.
This helps with fluency and understanding

Reading records are to be signed each time your
child has read at home.

Read other books for pleasure – sign these in the
records

Practice – new sounds – Set 1,2,3 (on the Letters)
Practice read and write red words – (Bookmarks)

Maths



Year 1

Count to 20 forwards and backwards

Know number bonds within 10 quickly (20) addition
subtraction

1 more 1 less – 20

Write numbers correctly

Year 2

Count to 100 forwards and from different numbers

Know number bonds – 20, 100

Count in 2's, 5's , 10's

Write numbers in words and numerals

Add and subtract – 2 2 digit numbers

Games / Websites – Topmarks

How can I help at home?



Read with your child a minimum of three times a week. Ask your children questions about what they have read to help with comprehension and understanding of the text. Please sign your child's reading record each time.

Y2 - Practise times tables to help with fluency. By the end of the year, Year Three children should be confident in answering their 2, 5, 10, 3,4 and 8 times tables. By the end of Year Four, children should be able to confidently answer their times tables up to 12x12.

Ensure that your children work independently when completing their homework but support them if they need it.

Y2 – will also get Weekly Maths – go out on Friday – hand in on a Wednesday.

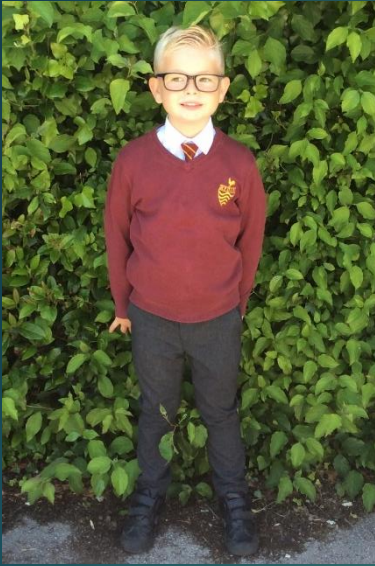

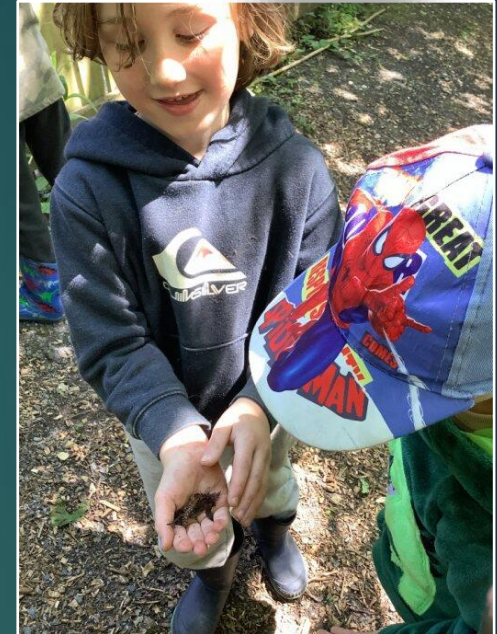

School uniform



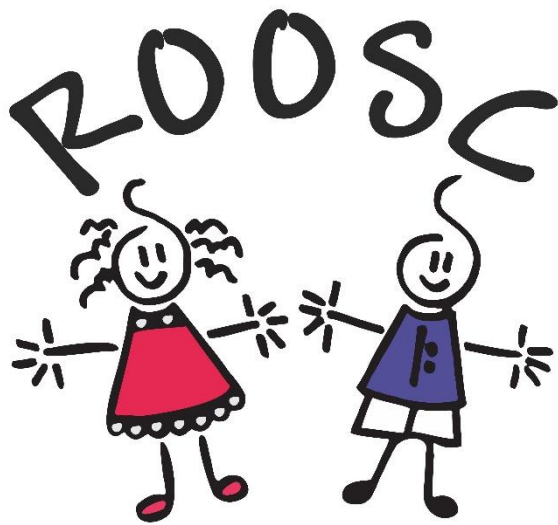
- School uniform to be worn each day. Children expected to wear shirt and tie unless due to sensory needs and spoken to SENCo.
